\* Class I prices and the Class II skim price as announced on or before 23<sup>rd</sup> of last month. Class I is announced at base zone differential of \$3.10 and is subject to location adjustments.

\*\* The processor assessment is an obligation under the Fluid Milk Promotion Order (7 CFR § 1160.101 *et seq.*). The Order requires that all persons who process and market commercially more than 3,000,000 pounds of fluid milk products in consumer-type packages in the 48 contiguous States and the District of Columbia on a monthly basis, excluding those fluid milk products delivered to the residence of a consumer, be assessed 20 cents per hundredweight on all marketings of such packaged fluid milk products during the month.

\*\*\* A final rule has been announced that amends § 1005.60 of the Appalachian Federal Milk Marketing Order, on an emergency basis. For a 3-month period beginning January 1, 2005, the rule implements a supplemental increase in the Class I milk price at a rate not to exceed \$.04 per hundredweight of milk in the Appalachian Order. The amount generated will be disbursed during February 2005 through April 2005 to qualifying handlers who incurred extraordinary transportation costs as a result of the hurricanes experienced in August and September 2004.
